discussions

When we have a discussion, we share our ideas and listen to others.

respect

Respect is caring how our words and actions may impact others.

decision making

Decision making means coming to an agreement about what to do.

elect

To choose someone for a particular role by voting for them.

rules

Rules are a set of guidelines to show us what we should or should not do.

representative

A person elected to act or speak for others.

positions of authority

A person in a position of authority has the power to make important decisions.

listen

To listen to someone means that we really hear what they are saying.

Share our views

To share our ideas means that we will tell other people what we are thinking.

Responsibilities

A responsibility is something you are expected to do.

Rule of law

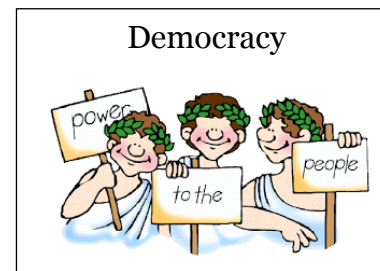
Rule of law means that no person or government is above the law and decisions must be made legally. We all have to follow the rules.

Democracy

A democracy means rule by the people. In a democracy, the people have a say how the government is run. They do this through voting.
