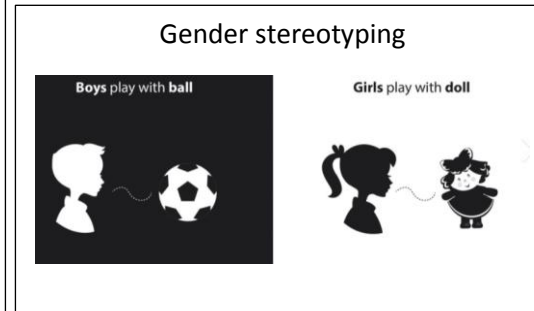
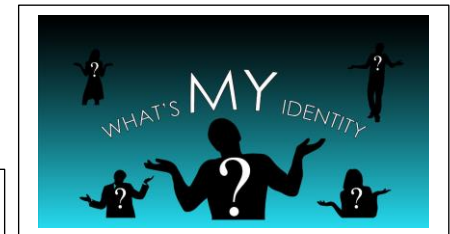


VOCABULARY DOZEN!

<p>culture Culture is a 'way of life' which is passed down from parents/ ancestors. Many things make up a culture e.g. food, language, music, art, religion, customs, beliefs etc.</p>
<p>traditions The handing down of information, beliefs or customs from one generation to another.</p>
<p>Media Media is a channel of communication e.g. newspapers, social media, T.V.</p>
<p>stereotype When we label or make assumptions about someone based on things like their gender, beliefs, abilities or appearance it's called stereotyping. e.g. All boys like football is a stereotype.</p>
<p>community A community is a group of people living together or working together in the same area. E.g We have a school community.</p>
<p>diversity Diversity describes the different traits and characteristics of individuals that make them unique. This can include age, gender, values, religious beliefs etc.</p>
<p>Perceptions Our perception is our own version (our interpretation) of the way we see/ understand things.</p>
<p>Lifestyles A person's lifestyle is the way in which a person or group chooses to live their life.</p>
<p>identity Our identity is who we are as a person. Lots of things impact on our identify e.g. our age, our beliefs, our hobbies, our community group, our family, our relationships with others etc.</p>
<p>Responsibilities A responsibility is something you are expected to do.</p>
<p>mutual respect Mutual means shared between two people. Mutual respect is understanding and respecting that we don't all share the same beliefs and values.</p>
<p>tolerance Tolerance is when you accept and show respect towards others who are different in their race, culture, habits and beliefs.</p>
