anonymous

When a person isn't identified by name and is unknown.

communicating

share or exchange information, news or ideas

sources of information

Sources of information are where we find things out.

online content

Any material available on the web (text, images, animations, music and videos).

inappropriate content

Any information that is disturbing, improper, and just plain wrong for children to see.

positive contributions

Positive contributions are the good things that you do that make other people feel happy or valued.

critically consider

This means so question and evaluate. You weigh up the good points and the bad points.

identity

Our identity is what makes us special and different to others. We can choose our identity in the online world (this might be different from our identity in the real world).

technology

Technology is the use of scientific knowledge for practical purposes that help our everyday lives.

social media

Websites or applications (apps) that allow users to create and share content or to take part in social networking.

mutual respect

Mutual means shared between two people. Mutual respect is understanding and respecting that we don't all share the same beliefs and values.

tolerance

Tolerance is when you accept and show respect towards others who are different in their race, culture, habits and beliefs.
