substances

A substance is a physical material from which something is made.

pharmacy

A pharmacy is where medical drugs are dispensed and sold.

prescription

A prescription is a written or printed document given by a qualified person for a specific drug.

medicine

Medicine is something that is used to help prevent, cure or relieve a disease.

injection

An injection is the act of administering a liquid into a person's body using a needle.

doctor

A qualified person who trained to help people that are ill or hurt and to help prevent illness.

nurse

A nurse is a person trained to care for people that are unwell or to help prevent illness.

unwell

Unwell means to be sick, not feel well or to be in poor health.

safe

protected from and not exposed to risk or danger

persuasion

Persuasion is the act of convincing someone.

illness

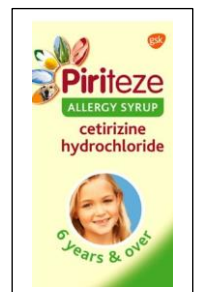
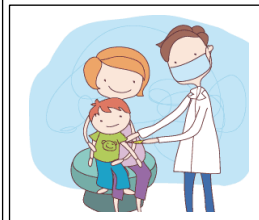
An illness is a disease or sickness affecting the body or the mind.

Rule of law

Rule of law means that no person or government is above the law and decisions must be made legally. We all have to follow the rules.
