risk

Risk is a situation that involving exposure to danger.

emergency

An emergency is a serious, unexpected and often dangerous situation that needs immediate action.

address

Your address is where you live. It will contain your house or flat number and your street as well as the town .g. 20, Reculver Walk, St Neots.

safe

protected from and not exposed to risk or danger

Sun safety

Sun safety is all about the things you can do to help you stay safe in the sun. e.g wearing sun cream

Water safety

Water safety is all about the things you can do to help you stay safe around water e.g. following the lifeguard's instructions.

Road safety

Road safety is all about the things that you can do to stay safe near roads e.g. looking both ways before you cross the road.

lost

If you are lost, it means you don't know where you are or how to find your way.

help

To help means to assist someone.

accident

An event that happens by chance (is not planned) that is usually harmful. Accidents can result in damage to people and property.

prevent

Prevent means to stop something happening.
