Aims/Objectives:

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in our school;
- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- identifies the children with the school;
- supports our commitment to inclusion;
- prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class;
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind;
- is considered good value for money by most parents;

Expectations

We expect all pupils to comply with this uniform policy, which will be monitored. Any pupil who falls short of these requirements will be advised of this fact by their class teacher and given the opportunity to improve. Continued failure to comply will be brought to the attention of the Headteacher.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items.

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school Uniform Policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

School Uniform List

Our school uniform consists of:

- grey trousers or skirts
- a white shirt or collared top (a 'polo' style shirt is ideal)
- a navy-blue jumper or sweatshirt
- black shoes or black trainers

In the Summer, the children may wear:

- grey shorts and a blue and white gingham style dress

Long hair should be tied up and no jewellery should be worn please.

P.E. Kit

- navy blue shorts
- a white tee-shirt

- trainers
- a sweatshirt and joggers
- hats, and gloves will be needed in winter
- a tee-shirt in their house colour

Football kits must not be worn.

PE Kit should be worn to school on the child's PE days.

Headscarves worn for religious reasons

These may be worn for religious reasons but must be in school colours - navy blue, black, or white.

Jewellery

It is not appropriate for children to wear jewellery except a sensible watch and a pair of small plain stud earrings.

Hairstyles

Hairstyles should be appropriate for school, i.e. no "mohicans", no designs cut into hair, no extremely short hair (no-guard or number 1) or bright coloured highlights. All long hair (shoulder length or longer) should be tied back. Headbands or hair bobbles should be plain dark blue, black, or brown

Nails

It is not appropriate for children to have artificial nails. Nails should be of an appropriate length and clear of any polish or embellishments except for 'special days' when the non-uniform policy may apply.

School Bags

There is no reason for children to bring large bags into school. There is a great shortage of space in the cloakrooms and large bags exacerbate the problem. Lunch boxes can be carried and stored on trolleys.
