How do we learn about behaviour?

By learning and following the rules

Work in PD lessons and Collective Worship (learning from bible stories and keeping ourselves safe.)

Following and setting good examples

Teachers modelling good behaviour

Learning about how others can influence us

By getting recognition from our friends and teachers for the right behaviour choices—it makes us feel good.

From our parents and family

From mistakes—talking them through with an adult and finding a way to do it better next time

What will happen if adults see people following the rules?

Adults might praise us, they may smile or say thank you.

House points and stickers may be given

Headteachers awards and certificates in Collective Worship each Friday.

Class rewards/treats

We earn adults trust and are trusted to do things around school.

What will happen if adults know someone is showing detrimental behaviour?

Adults will ask the person to stop. A reminder will be given. If needed, staff will try and help solve the problem.

Consequences will match the problem as far as possible. For example if you keep causing problems for others at break you may have to take a separate break time. If you are stopping others learning in class you may be asked to go to another class.

You may have to speak to a member of SLT

Our parents may be involved

What should I do if I know someone is not following the rules and I don't think the adults know?

- Ask them to stop
- Show them the right behaviour
- Tell an adult I trust.

Detrimental behaviour:

These are behaviours that make staff and our friends feel sad and worried.

Rudeness or being disrespectful

Physically hurting someone

Not following instructions

All forms of bullying

Vandalising school property
