Child Friendly Safeguarding Policy

Safeguarding means that all staff will:

Protect us from harm.

Ensure we are being safely looked after— in and out of school.

Make sure we are happy and feel safe.

Be someone who can help us and who we can talk to if we are worried or unhappy about something.



Keeping us safe..

We have safeguarding champions who will keep us safe from harm.

SAFE—staff, adults, friends, everyone—this reminds us who we can talk to if we are worried or scared.

We have fire safety marshalls and regularly practice evacuating the building safely

We have an invacuation procedure which we practice regularly.

We have a Junior Leadership Team (JLT) who are there to look out for us and help us when we need it.

Our school council ensures we have a voice in school to raise any general worries or concerns.

Visitors to our school wear lanyards so we know who they are and if they are trusted adults.

Our PD curriculum, including Anti-Bullying week ,teaches us how to keep ourselves healthy, safe and happy.

Our Computing curriculum teaches us e-safety to ensure we keep ourselves safe online.

In collective worship we are reminded often of how to keep safe and reminded who we can talk to. We also have Wednesday's Winning Ways to remind us how to keep ourselves safe.

We have red first aid boxes in our classrooms.

What happens if we have a concern:

Adults will listen to us, believe us and make sure that they make things better for us.

The adult we choose to talk to may have to talk to someone else to be able to fully resolve the problem.

Sometimes people from outside of school may come in to talk to us or help us.



If we need to talk:

We can talk to any adult in school we trust and feel safe with.

We have worry boxes in our classroom if we want to let an adult know we need to talk to them quietly.
