LATEST NEWS – EYFS, PHONICS AND SAT RESULTS 2023

We are pleased to share our results with you for Early Years, Phonics and Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Our results are compared with 2022 National Data that has been made available at this early stage for EYFS and KS1, National Data has been made available at KS2 level. At this point Cambridgeshire’s data is not yet available.

EYFS

Children are assessed by Mrs Cummings and her team through observation. To ensure that a child has a Good Level of Development (GLD) they will need to reach an Expected level in all three Prime Areas of Learning (Communication and Language, Physical Development, Personal, Social and Emotional Development as well as Literacy (Reading and Writing) and Maths (Number, and Numerical Patterns).

Phonics

All Year 1 children sit a phonics test at the end of Year 1. The teaching of phonics has been a focus for the school, and as a result of rigorous tracking, teaching phonics first session to ensure application during the day.

Key Stage 1 - Year 2 results:

In Key Stage 1 Mrs Allen assesses the pupils in school from their school work and supports her judgements using Key Stage 1 tests.

Years 3, 4 and 5

The children in Years 3, 4, and 5 are continually assessed throughout the year and also sit end of half termly assessments, their achievement and progress is tracked. There is no national or local data to compare with.

Key Stage 2 – Year 6 results:

At the end of KS2, SATs are taken by our Year 6 pupils in May. Maths, Reading, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) are marked externally. Writing and Science are assessed by the KS2 team. All of these assessments are moderated by the leadership team with some assessed by the Local Authority. Initial 2023 data has been made available so a comparison can be made.

School is achieving above national data (2022) in Reading, GPS and Reading, Writing, Maths (RWM) combined at or above the expected standard. School is achieving slightly below in Writing and inline in Maths at the end of KS2.
