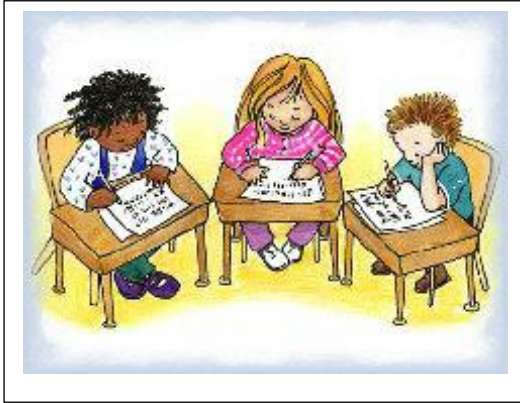




What makes a great writer at Eynesbury?

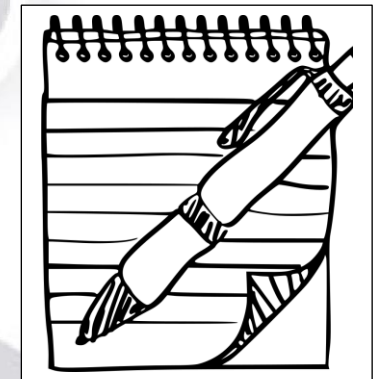
