amphibians

Animals that live in water and on land. They have smooth slimy, skin.

birds

All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.

fish

Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins for swimming and gills to breathe.

mammals

Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur, are born live and feed on their mother's milk, as babies.

reptiles

All reptiles breathe air. They have scales.

carnivore

Animals that eat other animals (meat).

herbivore

Animals that only eat plants.

omnivore

Animals that eat both meat and plants.

senses

How we find out about the world around us.

habitat

A habitat is where an animal lives.

diet

Diet is what an animal eats.

Taste – your mouth allows you to taste whether something is sweet or bitter.



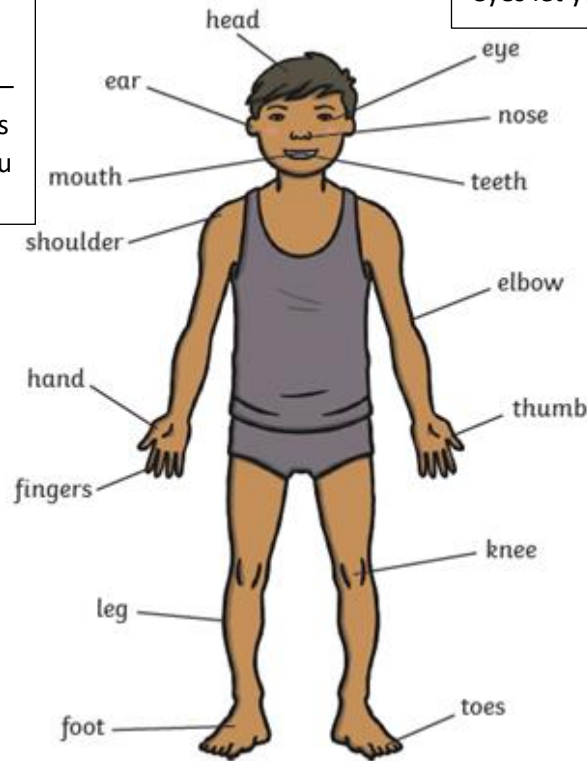
Smell – your nose enables you to smell, if something is nice or bad.
