



# What makes an Eynesbury Artist?



## An Eynesbury Artist can:

- Explore mark making, experiment with drawing lines
- Draw from direct observation, applying and using geometry and tonal shading when drawing.
- Draw still life from observation and for mark making.
- Draw using perspective, mathematical processes, design, detail and line.

## An Eynesbury Artist can:

- Control brush strokes and apply tints and shades when painting.
- Analyse painting by artists.
- Paint with expression.



## An Eynesbury Artist can:

- Use a range of materials to design and make products including craft, weaving, printmaking, sculpture and clay.
- Craft skills to design and make products.
- Know how to display and present work.
- Select materials for a purpose.

## An Eynesbury Artist can:

- Remember the primary colours and how to mix them to create secondary colours.
- Express feelings and emotions through colour.
- Use, express and experiment with line for purpose, then use appropriate language to describe lines.
- Identify, describe and use shape for purpose.
- Understand what tone is and how to apply this to their own work.

## EYFS and KS1

### An EYFS and KS1 Eynesbury Artists can:

- Express ideas and feelings through making marks, and sometimes give a meaning to the marks they make.
- Explore different materials, using all their sense to investigate them.
- Manipulate and play with different materials.
- Use their imagination as they consider what they can do with different materials.

## An Eynesbury Artist can:

- Recognise and describe key features of their own and other's work.
- Discuss own and other's work using an increasingly sophisticated use of art language (formal elements).
- Give reasoned evaluations of their own and others work which takes account of context and intention.

## An Eynesbury Artists can:

- Use sketchbooks to record thoughts and ideas and to experiment with materials.
- Make records of visual experiments.
- Create personal artwork using the artwork of others to stimulate them.
- Explore and create ideas for purposes and intentions.
